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This week, we will finish chapter 6 in our Everyday Math series. In reading, we will be reading a **Biography about Dr. Seuss** as our nightly **homework book**. Our Social Studies ties in nicely with this book.

Many of our **reading groups have been working with chapter books**, so this week, we will also continue reading the chapter books from last week during Daily 4 and Guided Reading groups. If you finished your "Fun read chapter book" last week, you will be given the option to choose another one this week. This book will be completed AT SCHOOL! However, if you would like to bring it back and forth and read it at home too, you are welcome to do so.

**** We are also continuing to work on our goal of 10 or more exit tickets by the end of the 9 weeks which is Mar. 20.** Time to complete these is given at Daily Reading center time AND as morning work. You can also read books at home and bring them in to complete the Exit Ticket on. We do one on our weekly reading story each week together. Therefore, you only need one additional book. We have students that are in the 30s with books and exit tickets! :) We are continuing to **check out books from our library that are on our level**. Some students have begun reading chapter books. Students may take their books home, but they **MUST BE RETURNED** each day.
