In reading, we will be reading and completing a book about text features and story elements. This book will also be about penguins. If this book is below your level, you will receive enriching activities to challenge you during Daily 4 and guided reading time. **** This week begins a new 9 weeks. With a new nine weeks comes A NEW BOOK goal of 10 or more exit tickets (mini book reports) by the end of the 9 weeks which is March 20!**


We all begin this new 9 weeks with 0. We will read and complete 10 Exit Tickets/book reports.

Just like the last 9 weeks, we are continuing to **check out 2 books from our library that are on our level**. Some students have begun reading chapter books. Students may take their books home, but they **MUST BE RETURNED** each day. I have books in the classroom

AND

The weekly reading story **DOES COUNT**. That means students only need 1 other book. Students may also read books from home and bring them in to complete the Exit Ticket/book report. Time is given to complete the exit tickets during Reading centers and each morning.

Last 9 weeks, we had students in the 30s and 40s for books and exit tickets!!!! Let's see who can read the most this 9 weeks! **A prize will be awarded for the student who reads the most AND a class prize will be awarded to everyone IF everyone completes their goal of 10 books.**
