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This week, we will continue chapter 8 in our Everyday Math series. For **extra Math practice**, you can always go to **Connect Ed** OR **Moby Math/fact fluency**, just like we do in class! Get to them from our Little Leopard Techie page. In reading, we will spend two weeks reading a **teacher chosen chapter book close to or on your reading level** as our nightly **homework book**. We will work on a book report over this book during our Daily 4 centers this week.

Many of our **reading groups have been working with chapter books**, so this week, we will also continue reading the chapter books during Daily 4 and Guided Reading groups.

**\*\* We are also continuing to work on our goal of 10 or more exit tickets by the end of the 9 weeks which is Mar. 20.** Time to complete these is given at Daily Reading center time AND as morning work. You can also read books at home and bring them in to complete the Exit Ticket on. We do one on our weekly reading story each week together. Therefore, you only need one additional book. We have students that are in the 40s with books and exit tickets! :) We are continuing to **check out books from our library that are on our level**. Some students have begun reading chapter books. Students may take their books home, but they **MUST BE RETURNED** each day.
