This week, we will continue chapter 8 in our Everyday Math series. For **extra Math practice**, you can always go to **Connect Ed** OR **Moby Math/fact fluency**, just like we do in class! Get to them from our Little Leopard Techie page. Your passwords are taped in your blue folder!

In reading, we will spend two weeks reading a **teacher chosen chapter book close to or on your reading level** as our nightly **homework book.** We will work on a book report over this book during our Daily 4 centers this week.
